Denis Sinor Distinguished Professor Emeritus of Uralic and Altaic Studies (Short Profile)

Updated Jan.06 and approved by Sinor

Born in Hungary in 1916, he was educated in Hungary, Switzerland, and France. As a student, he received several fellowships in Hungary and in France where between 1939 and 1948, he held various teaching and research assignments in France. A member of the French Resistance, he joined the Free French Forces and was demobilized in November 1945.

From 1948 to 1962 he was on the Faculty of Oriental Studies at Cambridge University, England. In 1962 he moved to IU, 1963-1981 he was Chairman of the Department of Uralic and Altaic Studies. In 1967 he founded the Asian Studies Research Institute, later renamed Research Institute for Inner Asian Studies, which he directed until 1981. 1963-1988 he was Director of the Inner Asian and Uralic National Resource Center, the only one of its kind in the country.

A former president of the American Oriental Society, Sinor has been very active in various national and international scholarly societies in which he has held and still holds important positions. He is still serving on various UNESCO commissions.

He has received two Guggenheim Fellowships, and grants from the Rockefeller Foundation, the ACLS, NEH, and IREX. He is a Corresponding Member of the French Academy, an Honorary Member of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences, a Foreign Member of the Academia Europaea. Honors received include a doctorate *honoris causa* of the University of Szeged (1971), Honorary Memberships of the Société Asiatique (Paris), and the Societas Uralo-Altaica (Hamburg). He was awarded the Arminius Vambery Medal (1983), the Gold Medal of the Permanent International Altaistic Conference (1982, 1996), the "Order of the Star" of Hungary (1986), the Silver Avicenna Medal of UNESCO (1998), the Medal of Honor of the American Oriental Society (1999) and the Thomas Hart Benton Mural Medaillon of IU. In his honor, The Royal Asiatic Society of Great Britain has created a "Denis Sinor Medal for Inner Asian Studies". On the occasion of his 85th birthday the Oriental Institute of the Russian Academy honored him with a *Festschrift*. In 2002 Denis Sinor was the Recipient of a medal from the University of Szeged, which referenced Aimperishable services rendered to the university. Also in 2002 he was Elected Honorary Member of the Institute of Linguistics of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences.

More recently he was awarded an "Honorary Professorship" by the Institute of Oriental Studies, Russian Academy of Sciences, in 2005 and inducted into the Presidents Circle by President Herbert, Indiana University in September 2005. In December 2005 he received the UNESCO 60th Anniversary Medal "In recognition of his outstanding contribution to the preparation of the *History of the Civilizations of Central Asia*."

Author of several books and scores of articles, Sinor has traveled extensively in Asia, including Afghanistan, Chinese Turkestan, Soviet Central Asia, Northern Pakistan, Siberia, Inner and Outer Mongolia, and for the heck of it the edges of Antarctica and to the North Pole.

A member of the Cosmos Club (Washington, D.C.), of the Explorers Club (N.Y.C.), and of the United Oxford and Cambridge University Club (London).

Professor Sinor's presence at IU has made Bloomington known in Altaic and Inner Asian Studies around the world.
